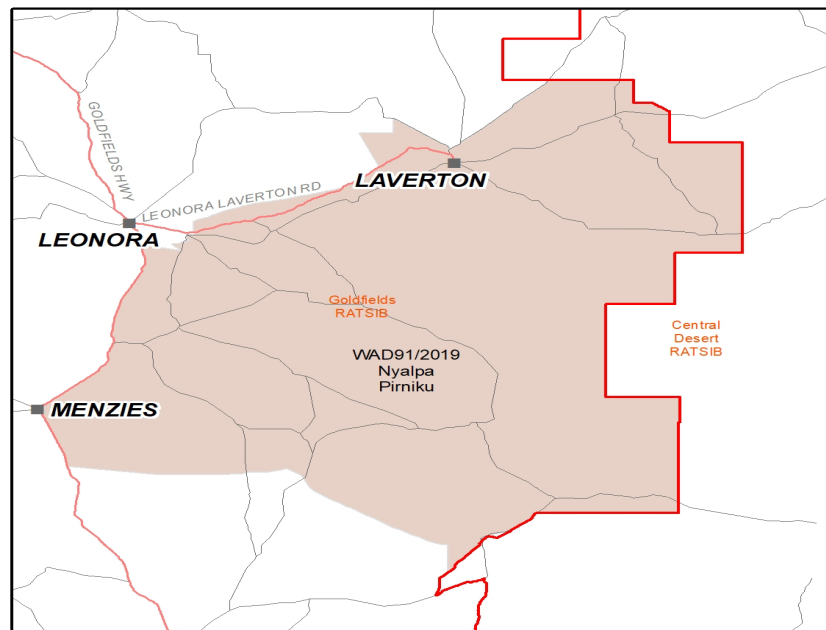

## Travel Assistance
