

AUTHORISATION MEETING NOTICE PROPOSED NEW NATIVE TITLE CLAIM

Purpose of this meeting:

1. The purpose of this meeting is to discuss, consider and decide whether to authorise a group of people (called the **Applicant**) to bring a **new native title claim** in the Federal Court of Australia over the land and waters shown in the area on the map **below**. The area is in the Goldfields of Western Australia, including Agnew and surrounds.
2. The matters **to be discussed** and **decisions to be made** at this meeting will include:
 - whether to make a new native title claim;
 - who are the people who will be included in the claim group;
 - what is the decision-making process of the claim group;
 - what are the rights and interests claimed;
 - who the members of the Applicant will be;
 - authorising the Applicant to make the claim and deal with any matters arising in relation to the claim on behalf of the claim group;
 - any conditions or limitations on the authority of the Applicant;
 - the name of the new claim; and
 - Legal representation and support.

Please note: the meeting has been scheduled for two days. The first day will include discussion and consideration of matters listed above. The second day will include further discussion and the making of the final decisions and resolutions concerning the matters listed above. If you hold or may hold native title rights and interests in the area of the proposed claim, it is important that you attend the meeting on both days.

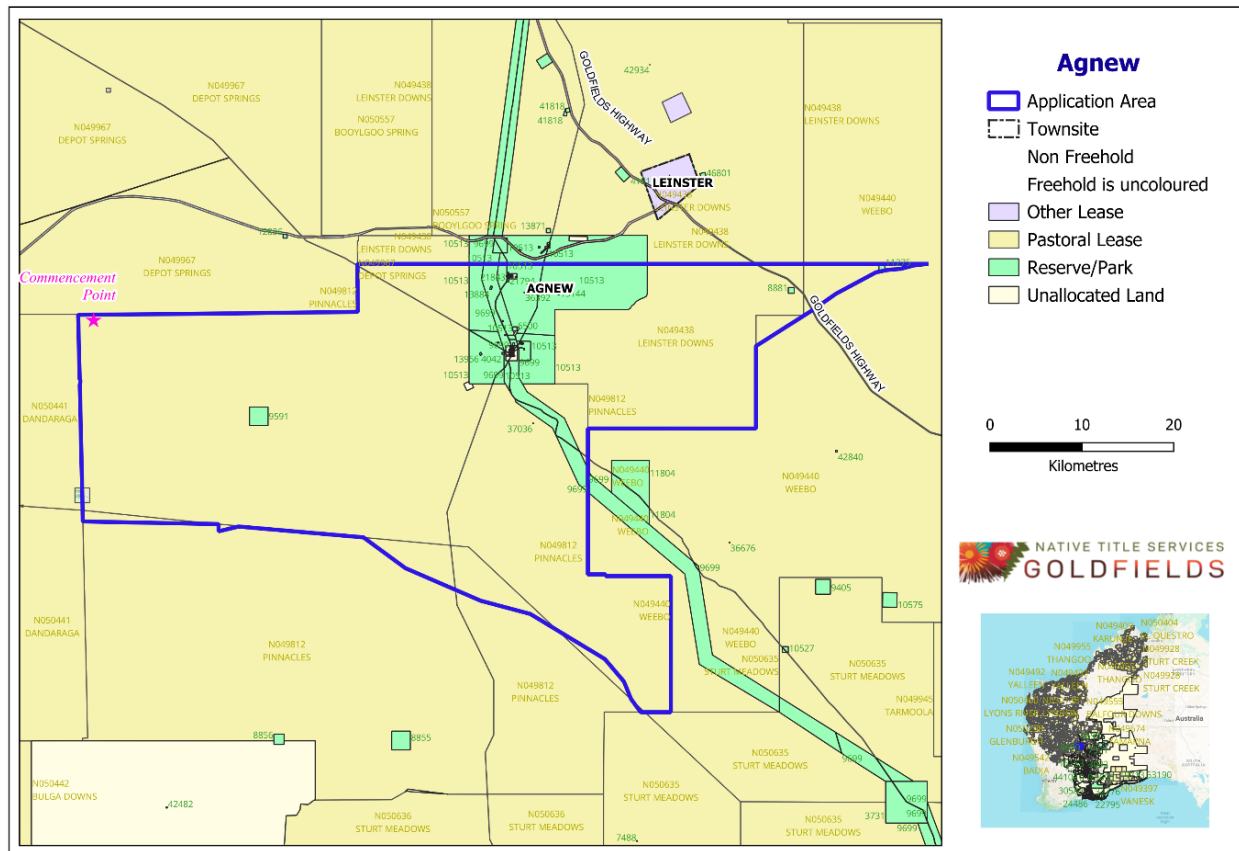
2. you consider that you or your family may hold traditional rights and interests in any part of the proposed claim area under the relevant traditional laws and customs due to:
- a) Your own birth, or long association with part or all of the proposed claim area;
 - b) Your ancestor's birth, or long association with part or all of the proposed claim area; or
 - c) Your own religious, sacred and/or ritual knowledge for part or all of the proposed claim area.

The list above is a proposed, and non-exhaustive list. It is not intended to be a final description of the native title claim group. The final description will be decided at the meeting, following further consideration of those who may hold native title rights and interests in the proposed claim area.
